



## Ebulletin 152 – June 2020

Never before has it been so challenging to keep up-to-date! News is coming out thick and fast every day to our trustees. We are including (as we have done on previous ebulletins) a set of news items from these which we feel are of most interest to GP Practices and their patients, calling it 'National news roundup'. However, there are quite a lot since our last update, and we apologise that some of these 'lists' may feel overwhelming.

### 1. N.A.P.P. Radio broadcast

In 2018 and 2019, N.A.P.P. trustees spent over three hours in the studio doing a series of live and pre-recorded interviews with a wide range of community radio stations throughout the UK. Some of the live recordings lasted as long as 15 minutes, generating lots of discussion. It was a new venture for N.A.P.P. but one that we felt was very successful. We were able to promote the importance of PPGs, share information about what PPGs can do and, importantly, publicise how members of the public can find out more about their own PPG. The total audience we reached exceeded 3.5 million listeners.

On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June, we will repeat this experience. Our President, Patricia Wilkie, Chairman Folarin Majekodunmi and chair of a PPG, Gemma Jackson, will be on air taking calls and discussing all aspects of PPGs. Once edited, the final podcasts will be available on our YouTube channel, via our website. We will send out another note when they're up and available to listen to.

Almost all GP practices in England have signed up to the new Primary Care Network (PCN) contract for the next year, meaning they will receive a share of half a billion pounds a year of extra investment to employ more staff and deliver more services in or near to people's homes – a total investment of £1.4 billion by 23/24 to help deliver an extra 26,000 workforce roles.
